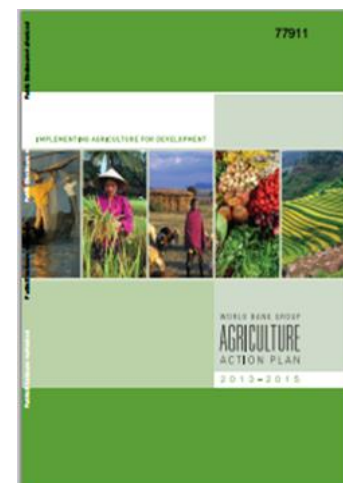
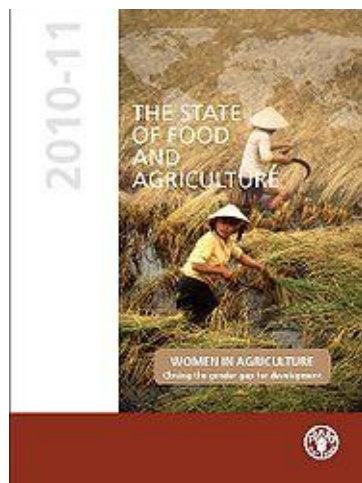
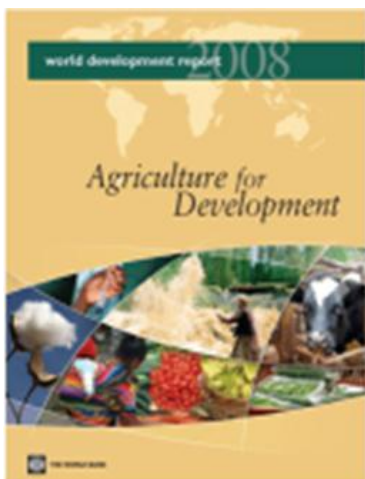


Gender in Agriculture Sourcebook (2009)



- Key tool to operationalize gender mainstreaming in agriculture; a Joint World Bank, FAO and IFAD initiative
- Main audience is the technical staff in agencies and governments
- 16 Modules. Structure: *Overview* (key gender issues); *Thematic Notes* (proven investments that can be recommended for implementation and scaling up); and *Innovative Activity Profiles* (new innovative projects/activities)

“The design of many development policies continues to assume wrongly that farmers and rural workers are men.”

“Equalizing men’s and women’s access to productive resources, could increase agricultural output in developing countries by 2.5 to 4 percent.”

“Closing gender gaps is a core development objective in its own right. It is also smart economics”

“By 2015, 100% of agriculture projects to include gender analysis; 75% to include gender actions and gender-disaggregated M&E”
