
World Bank headquarters June 9-11, 2015. I regularly join panels for quality enhancement reviews of health projects under preparation.

accountability. In Nepal CSO are hired to provide HIV/AIDS related service to most at risk population in several districts. In addition, the community nutrition project in Nepal where communities decide on nutrition interventions they would like to see in their village, CSO are hired facilitate community discussion/interaction and support the identification of nutritional interventions. Finally, CSO are hired to facilitate social auditing of health facilities. In Afghanistan, some CSO were hired to provide health services in rural areas while some are hired to monitor the quality and quantity of service provision by undertaking community level monitoring/verification.

At WHO, he led the Commission on Social Determinants of Health and oversaw the production of the annual World Health Report. He has been a co-founder of many partnerships including the Global Alliance on Vaccines and Immunization (GAVI) as well as efforts to increase access to HIV treatment for mothers and innovative approaches to training community-based midwives in Bangladesh.
