

(Baseline 2009, Pre-READ)



Indicator	Activity Description/Date	Output/Outcome
EC2 GOT's commitment to new UEE system	Preparation of the Legal Package for the READ Phase II (RE) Grant supporting the establishment of the new UEE (March – July 2011)	Legal Agreement signed by TJ/WB. Grant is effective and funds are available to implement the NTC Master Plan. (Launch mid-October 2011)
EC3	Negotiate annual state budget allocations for the NTC with the GOT, MOF and MOE (June – August 2011)	The 2011 state budget for the NTC is amended and the 2012 one is approved in consultation with the WB
EC4	Recruit key staff for the NTC (April – October 2011)	The NTC is staffed to implement its Master Plan supported by READ

EC1	Development and piloting the NTC and UEE Procedures, regulatory and legal documents.	The documents are developed and adopted by the GOT and respective entities providing regulatory and legal basis for national introduction of the UEE in 2014 and further work on NLSA and ILSA.
EC2	Designing and conducting a PR and communications strategy.	Key stakeholders are well informed about the new UEE system and support it. Universities do not resist.
EC3	State budget funds annual allocation for the NTC. Revenues collection from UEE fees by the NTC	NTC has financial sustainability to conduct UEEs annually after 2014.
