1. BACKGROUND

The World Bank recently launched a new project, funded from EU structural funds under the Technical Assistance Operational Program, to support the Romanian Prime Minister's Office in embedding results-oriented practices in the public sector. As part of the project, the World Bank is putting together a team of sector experts to work in the Chancellery of the Prime Minister ("Chancellery"), with the goal to facilitate the better and faster delivery of results in four priority areas. These include tax administration, public procurement, youth employment and energy. This initiative presents an innovation in public sector management, shifting the focus from creating policy to the delivery of results to citizens.

The World Bank is currently seeking an *Energy Expert* (Consultant) to work in a multi-disciplinary team in the Chancellery, which will include international advisors on delivery, World Bank sector specialists, and local staff; all oriented towards helping the Prime Minister and Government to deliver results in the selected priority areas. The Energy Expert will in these efforts specifically support the responsible Line Ministries and agencies in the energy sector. The Expert will work in partnership with relevant actors across the government to ensure the improvements in achieving the results by a) supporting Ministries in agreeing on delivery plans; b) tracking the progress on these, and c) analyzing the bottlenecks in the delivery system and jointly identifying the solutions.

2. DUTIES AND ACCOUNTABILITIES

The Energy Expert's main responsibilities are to:

- Serve as the key technical counterpart for the area of energy in relation to the relevant government counterparts and key stakeholders involved in achieving the energy policy results;
- Work with key stakeholders to develop understanding of 'what works' in improving the outcomes in the energy sector, existing policy and reform options;
- Coordinate closely with the World Bank energy specialists for the guidance and synergies with the ongoing projects in Romania in this field;
- Support Line Ministries in the process of jointly defining the delivery plans for the key priority outcomes with the relevant government institutions, including the identification of targets, trajectories, indicators and data sources;
- Track progress on the agreed measures implemented by the relevant institutions and their contribution towards achieving the results;
- Lead projects and reviews involving multiple stakeholders to analyze blockages to delivery and identify solutions;

- Prepare regular and ad hoc progress reports for the Head of the Unit and the Prime Minister;
- Contribute to assessing the government's ability to deliver the target results and develop approaches to building capacity in the Chancellery of the Prime Minister as well as relevant institutions for making improvements in this area.

3. SELECTION CRITERIA

The Energy Expert will have substantial knowledge of the energy reform efforts in Romania and in Europe, including the key policy issues and energy projects.

Requisite qualifications include:

- At least 6-8 years of professional experience in the energy sector, ideally on the private sector advisory as well as policy side;
- At least a Master level University Degree, or equivalent in the field of the assignment (Business Administration, Public Administration, Management, Economics or similar);
- Demonstrated understanding of the present energy sector challenges, reform efforts and Romania's international commitments, and possible improvements in achieving these;
- Demonstrated analytical and problem-solving skills;
- Demonstrated project management skills, involving multiple stakeholders;
- Demonstrated change management skills;
- Past experience in leading a policy dialogue with government counterparts and other stakeholders;
- Excellent writing skills, with the ability to write clear, concise, and evidence-based reports;
- Excellent networking skills and the capacity to engage with stakeholders to foster cooperation and removal of bottlenecks;
- Ability to work under tight deadlines and with limited supervision;
- Fluency in Romanian and English (speaking and writing).
