Abstract:

This paper is a product of research on the determinants of demand for personal travel in developing countries which was initiated in 1982 by the World Bank's Transportation Department and funded from the Bank's research budget. In addition to an empirical investigation of travel demand in five countries, chiefly on the basis of household surveys, the research was to propose a form of travel survey suitable for developing countries and allowing travel data (including trips, process and purposes) to be correlated with socio-economic, demographic and expenditure data on households, covering travelers and non-travelers.
