Introduction

- A collaboration between WB, IFRTD and other national and regional partners.
- To date, 3 workshops held in Kenya [2004], Sri Lanka [2005] and South Africa [2006].
- The common objective of the workshops is to provide a platform for consultation and learning among peers in regard to existing trends and challenges in transport performance monitoring.
- The workshop series emphasize sharing and learning, and therefore presentations and discussions are not necessarily expected to advance or articulate formal policy positions.

Some issues arising from previous workshops

- Transport sector has lagged behind other sectors in linking its performance to the achievement of wider development outcomes. [Transport outputs hidden in other sectors]
- In some countries, transport performance monitoring only done in small enclaves of donor funded projects. Not based on the need for public accountability.
- Need to go beyond sub-sector performance accounting [e.g., costs of operation etc] to wider notions of impact monitoring [Poverty, inclusion, safety, governance etc]
- Need for national coordination mechanisms for the collection and management of transport sector data. This would overcome current institutional fragmentation among the multitude of agencies and departments involved in transport sector issues.
- Need for baseline information on national travel patterns, characteristics and challenges. This could be done through National Household Travel Surveys or inclusion of travel related questions in regular household surveys [demographic, consumption/expenditure surveys etc]
