Efficient PP system

- Regulation
- Implementation
- Monitoring
- Ensuring efficiency and improvement in PP
- Slovenian measures for efficient PP

PP Regulation

- Simple to understand and carry out
- Flexibility for procurers
- Stability
 - often amendments of rules are not welcomed
 - legal certainty
- Framework and guidelines, not solutions for concrete procurements, breaches of law and anomalies
- Proportionality
 - duration and costs of procurement procedure
 - needed human resources, ...

PP Implementation

- In line with legal provisions
- Case-by-case situations
 - relevance of fundamental principles
 - all circumstances cannot be foreseen and regulated in legislation
- Common sense

PP Monitoring

- Several institutions with different competencies:
 - National Review Commission for Reviewing Public Procurement Award Procedures
 - Court of Audit
 - Budget Supervision Office
 - Anti-Corruption Commission, ...
- Correct implementation of legal provisions
- Efficient spending of public money
- Collection of statistical data to assess state of play
- Ex ante vs. ex post monitoring

Ensuring efficiency and improvement in PP

- Feed-back to contracting authorities
- Trainings and seminars
- Sharing good and bad practices
- Enforcing accountability and appropriate sanctions for mistakes and breaches of law
 - special attention to repeated offenders
 - feeling: there is someone watching
- Measures tailored to the specific situation and practices within a country, taking account of mentality of people involved in PP

Slovenian measures for efficient PP

- High level of transparency in PP
 - access of PP tendering and internal documentation
 - mandatory publications, reporting when corruption risks are higher
 - low thresholds for publications, but simplified procedure
 - public opening of bids as a rule
- Standardisation, uniformity, automatisation
- □ Joint PP
- E-procurement and PP tools
 - Virtual Company Dossier

Slovenian measures for efficient PP

- Monitoring
 - most statistical data collected from and through publication of notices on national PP platform
 - standardised answers provided for PP publications (legends, link to the Business Register,...)
 - traceability throughout procurement process
 - annual analysis of statistical data
 - analysis of specific PP institutes and anomalies when needed
- Added value of PP
 - secondary goals, sector politics
 - multiple use and reuse of retrieved statistical data, sharing info
