- Chile invents the proxy means test in 1980
- Maharashtra state in India is running and evaluating an Employment Guarantee scheme
- Jamaica replaces food subsidies with food stamps in 1984
- The bleak prospects for growth and fiscal pressure puts social assistance and targeting on the agenda

Headline 1987 Bolivia ESF: 1st WB loan for social costs of adjustment

- Starts Wave of Social Funds
 - vehicle for funding labor intensive public works
 - quickly spreads to 50+ countries
 - many evolve in directions of decentralization or CDD programs
 - a plurality focus on labor intensive public works, response to natural disasters, or social care services





Headline 1994 Armenia invents Paros PMT system

- initially used for humanitarian assistance
- in 1997 used to target new Family Poverty Benefit
- reform had elements common to others in the region: consolidation of many small programs; move from categorical to needs based targeting;

replaces untargeted electricity subsidy with targeted cash subsidy

a continuing story of improving systems and results



Headline 1995/7 Brazil and Mexico start CCT Programs

- Beginning of wave of CCTs
- Spreads to 30+ countries

Headline 2001 World Bank Social Protection Strategy Paper

Headline 2002 Chile Solidario Established

- Focuses on chronic poor
 Linking them into many existing social protection programs
 Provides pyscho-social support as well
- •Is echoed in time in many other countries working on the "graduation' or 'social inclusion' or 'activation' agenda



Headline 2004 Ethiopia Productive Safety Net Program

- a large scale safety net
 - mostly public works
 - unconditional cash transfer for those who can't work
 - reform of humanitarian aid to make it more productive "saving livelihoods as well as lives"

Mahatma Gandi Indian National Rural Employment Guarantee Act (NREGA)

- Guarantees up to 100 days of employment per year for adult rural Indians
- A symbol of and inspiration to the rights based approach to social protection
- A reminder that of success is determined by implementation and governance

Headline 2006 Livingstone Call for Action

- Representatives from 13 African countries;
- Calls for more 'social transfer' programs,
- More capacity building, long term funding commitments;
- Sets schedule for developing costed local plans and bi-annual S-S conference



Headline 2006 World Bank WDR: Equity and Development

- Re-establishes within the World Bank the importance of equity, a language to discuss it
- Makes it easier to articulate that safety nets have both equity and risk management goals
