- 3- Young people are often on the receiving end of development projects/initiatives; how do you think youth can crossover to leadership roles in development projects/initiatives?
- 4- What are the characteristics of a successful development project led by young people? How can projects focused on youth and/or led by youth gain credibility, momentum, and have a real impact?

Entrepreneurship

- 5- What is the importance of *entrepreneurship* in development and how can it be leveraged to create real impact?

Innovation

- 6- Innovation is often left up to and expected from young people; what do you think about the role of youth in innovation, especially in development?
