WOMEN, BUSINESS AND THE LAW

Women, Business and the Law 2021 measures laws and regulations that affect women's economic opportunity in 190 economies. Amidst a global pandemic that threatens progress toward gender equality, the report **identifies barriers** to women's economic participation and **encourages reform** of discriminatory laws. This year, the study also includes important findings on government responses to the COVID-19 crisis and pilot research related to childcare and women's access to justice.

This **dissemination toolkit** offers resources for donors, citizens, policymakers, international and local experts, donors, partners, and civil society organizations seeking to embed *Women, Business and the Law* findings into their work. Reforms that unleash economic opportunities for women can also increase **shared prosperity for all**.
